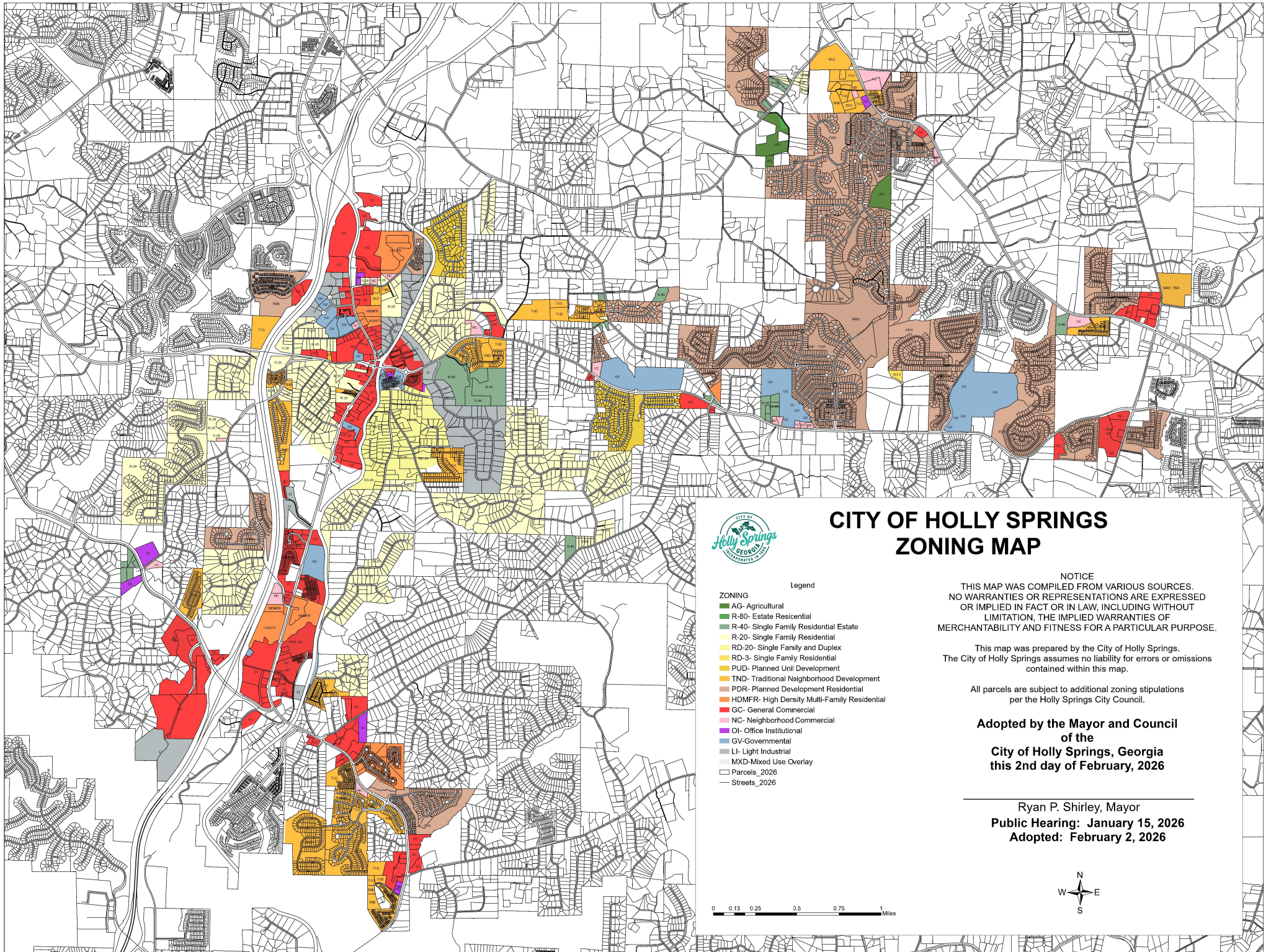

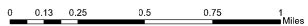

AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF HOLLY SPRINGS, GEORGIA, TO PROVIDE FOR SEVERABILITY; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

The Council of the City of Holly Springs hereby ordains that:

Section 1. The Official Zoning Map of the City of Holly Springs, dated January 22, 2026 and attached to this ordinance, presented for public hearing at the January 15, 2026 Holly Springs Planning Commission meeting, recommended for approval by the Holly Springs Planning Commission at its January 15, 2026 meeting, and reviewed by Holly Springs City Council at its January 22, 2026 Council Meeting, be adopted in its entirety.

Section 2. If any Section, sub-section, sentence, clause, phrase or any portion of this Ordinance be declared invalid or unconstitutional by any court or competent jurisdiction or if the provisions of any part of this Ordinance as applied to any particular situation or set of circumstances shall be declared invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity shall not be construed to affect the portions of this Ordinance not so held to be invalid. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the City Council to provide for separable and divisible parts and he does hereby adopt any and all parts hereof as may not be held invalid for any reason.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon approval by the Mayor and Council.

A resolution opposing a bill before the Georgia General Assembly that was sponsored by Rep. Brad Thomas that would amend the City of Holly Springs' Charter to revise city boundaries, reduce the city council from five to four members, and establish new council districts. Rep. Brad Thomas has not consulted with the City of Holly Springs either before or after introducing the local legislation and has not communicated the purposes or goals of amending the City Charter.

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF HOLLY SPRINGS, GEORGIA, OPPOSING LC 47
3856, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.**

WHEREAS, the Georgia General Assembly is considering **LC 47 3856**, sponsored by **Rep. Brad Thomas**, which would **amend the City of Holly Springs' Charter to revise city boundaries, reduce the city council from five to four members, establish new council districts, and for other purposes**; and

WHEREAS, the City of Holly Springs has determined that the bill would **undermine local control**; and

WHEREAS, since voting in Holly Springs is city-wide, the bill would reduce **representation for Holly Springs residents by decreasing the number of city council members from five to four**; and

WHEREAS, because Rep. Brad Thomas has not consulted with the City of Holly Springs either before or after introducing the local legislation and has not communicated the purposes or goals of amending the City Charter, the bill does not adequately consider **local community needs or input from the City's elected officials and residents**; and

WHEREAS, the City of Holly Springs believes public policy in Georgia should **protect local governance, promote fairness, and safeguard constitutional rights**; and

WHEREAS, passage of **LC 47 3856** would not serve the best interests of **Holly Springs residents**;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the **City of Holly Springs** hereby **opposes LC 47 3856** and urges members of the Georgia General Assembly to **vote against** its passage; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Governor, **Lieutenant Governor, Speaker of the House, and members of the Georgia General Assembly representing this jurisdiction**, and be made part of the public record.

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend an Act creating a new charter for the City of Holly Springs in the County of
2 Cherokee, approved March 18, 1980 (Ga. L. 1980, p. 3281), as amended, so as to revise the
3 boundaries of the city; to provide that the city council shall be composed of four instead of
4 five members; to provide new city council district boundaries; to provide for definitions and
5 inclusions; to provide for continuation in office of the current councilmembers; to provide
6 effective dates; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 **SECTION 1.**

9 An Act creating a new charter for the City of Holly Springs in the County of Cherokee,
10 approved March 18, 1980 (Ga. L. 1980, p. 3281), as amended, is amended by revising
11 Section 1.02 as follows:

12 "SECTION 1.02.
13 Corporate boundaries.

14 (a)(1) The boundaries of this city shall be those described in described in Appendix A
 15 attached to and made a part of this charter and further identified as 'User: HD 21 Plan
 16 Name: HollySprings-city-2026 Plan Type: Local', with such alterations as may be made
 17 from time to time in the manner provided by general state law.

18 (2) For the purposes of such plan:

19 (A) The term 'VTD' shall mean and describe the same geographical boundaries as
 20 provided in the report of the Bureau of the Census for the United States decennial
 21 census of 2020 for the State of Georgia. The separate numeric designations in a district
 22 description which are underneath a VTD heading shall mean and describe individual
 23 Blocks within a VTD as provided in the report of the Bureau of the Census for the
 24 United States decennial census of 2020 for the State of Georgia; and

25 (B) Except as otherwise provided in the description of any district, whenever the
 26 description of any district refers to a named city, it shall mean the geographical
 27 boundaries of that city as shown on the census maps for the United States decennial
 28 census of 2020 for the State of Georgia.

29 (b) The boundaries of this city at all times shall be shown on a map, a written description
 30 or any combination thereof, to be retained permanently in the office of the clerk and to be
 31 designated, as the case may be: Official Map (or Description) of the Corporate Limits of
 32 the City of Holly Springs, Georgia. Photographic, typed, or other copies of such map or
 33 description certified by the clerk shall be admitted as evidence in all courts and shall have
 34 the same force and effect as with the original map or description.

35 (c) The city council may provide for the redrawing of any such map by ordinance to reflect
 36 lawful changes in the corporate boundaries. A redrawn map shall supersede for all
 37 purposes the earlier map or maps which it is designated to replace."

38 **SECTION 2.**

39 Said Act is further amended by revising Section 2.01 as follows:

40 "SECTION 2.01.

41 City council creation; composition; number; election.

42 Except as otherwise specifically provided in this charter, the legislative authority of the
43 government of this city shall be vested in a city council to be composed of a mayor and
44 four councilmembers. The mayor and councilmembers shall be elected in the manner
45 provided by Article V of this charter."

46 **SECTION 3.**

47 Said Act is further amended by revising Section 5.02 as follows:

48 "SECTION 5.02.

49 Regular elections.

50 (a)(1) For purposes of electing members of the city council, the city is divided into four
51 districts. One member of the council shall be elected from each such district. The four
52 districts shall be and correspond to those four numbered districts described in and
53 attached to and made a part of this Act and further identified as 'User: HD 21 Plan:
54 HollySprings-p1-2026 Plan Type: Local'.

55 (2)(A) For the purposes of such plan:

56 (i) The term 'VTD' shall mean and describe the same geographical boundaries as
57 provided in the report of the Bureau of the Census for the United States decennial
58 census of 2020 for the State of Georgia. The separate numeric designations in a
59 district description which are underneath a VTD heading shall mean and describe
60 individual Blocks within a VTD as provided in the report of the Bureau of the Census
61 for the United States decennial census of 2020 for the State of Georgia; and

62 (ii) Except as otherwise provided in the description of any district, whenever the
63 description of any district refers to a named city, it shall mean the geographical
64 boundaries of that city as shown on the census maps for the United States decennial
65 census of 2020 for the State of Georgia.

66 (B) Any part of the City of Holly Springs which is not included in any district
67 described in paragraph (1) of this subsection shall be included within that district
68 contiguous to such part which contains the least population according to the United
69 States decennial census of 2020 for the State of Georgia.

70 (3) Except for incorporated islands of the City of Holly Springs, any part of the City of
71 Holly Springs which is described in paragraph (1) of this subsection as being included in
72 a particular district shall nevertheless not be included within such district if such part is
73 not contiguous to such district. Such noncontiguous part shall instead be included within
74 that district contiguous to such part which contains the least population according to the
75 United States decennial census of 2020 for the State of Georgia.

76 (4)(A) Those members of the city council who are serving as such on the effective date
77 of this Act and any person selected to fill a vacancy in any such office shall continue
78 to serve as such members until the regular expiration of their respective terms of office
79 and upon the election and qualification of their respective successors.

80 (B)(i) The initial councilmember elected from District 1 as newly described under
81 this Act shall be elected at the 2026 municipal general election to a four-year term of
82 office.

83 (ii) District 3, as it exists immediately prior to the effective date of this Act, shall be
84 designated as District 2, but as newly described under this Act, and on and after the
85 effective date of this Act, the councilmember serving from that former district shall
86 be deemed to be serving from and representing his or her district as newly described
87 under this Act and the successor to such member shall be elected at the 2028
88 municipal general election to a four-year term of office.

89 (iii) District 5, as it exists immediately prior to the effective date of this Act, shall be
90 designated as District 3, but as newly described under this Act, and on and after the
91 effective date of this Act, the councilmember serving from that former district shall
92 be deemed to be serving from and representing his or her district as newly described
93 under this Act and the successor to such member shall be elected at the 2028
94 municipal general election to a four-year term of office.

95 (iv) District 4, as it exists immediately prior to the effective date of this Act, shall
96 continue to be designated as District 4, but as newly described under this Act, and on
97 and after the effective date of this Act, the initial councilmember elected from
98 District 4 as newly described under this Act shall be elected at the 2026 municipal
99 general election to a four-year term of office."

100 SECTION 4.

101 (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of this section, this Act shall become
102 effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.

103 (b) The provisions of Sections 2 and 3 of this Act necessary to conduct elections for the
104 members of the mayor and council in 2026 shall become effective upon the approval of this
105 Act by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval. The remaining
106 provisions of Sections 2 and 3 shall become effective on January 1, 2027.

107 SECTION 5.

108 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF HOLLY SPRINGS MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL
REQUESTING FUNDING FOR THE CITY OF HOLLY SPRINGS HICKORY ROAD
WIDENING PROJECT, PHASE II**

WHEREAS, the City of Holly Springs is committed to providing safe, efficient, and reliable transportation infrastructure for residents, businesses, and visitors; and

WHEREAS, the City of Holly Springs Hickory Road Widening Project, Phase II is intended to add capacity, sidewalks, turn lanes and a median on Hickory Road from Red Bud Lane to Sequoyah Circle to improve roadway safety, reduce congestion, improve pedestrian access, support economic development; and

WHEREAS, the project will serve residents, commuters, emergency services, schools, businesses, and is expected to result in benefits such as improved safety, reduced travel time, environmental benefits, economic growth; and

WHEREAS, engineering design and planning efforts have identified the need for this project due to the traffic volume, safety concerns, aging infrastructure, growth; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost of the Hickory Road Widening Project, Phase II is \$4,600,000 (four million six hundred thousand dollars), which exceeds the funding currently available to the City of Holly Springs; and

WHEREAS, funding assistance from the Georgia Department of Transportation would enable the timely planning, design, and/or construction of this project; and

WHEREAS, the City of Holly Springs is willing to meet all applicable requirements associated with the requested funding, including reporting, compliance, and any required local match;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The City of Holly Springs formally supports the Hickory Road Widening Project, Phase II, and affirms that it is a priority transportation improvement.
2. The City of Holly Springs hereby requests funding in the amount of \$4,600,000 from the Georgia Department of Transportation to support the engineering, right-of-way acquisition and construction of the project.
3. The Mayor of Holly Springs is authorized to submit applications, execute required documents, and take all necessary actions to secure and administer the requested funding on behalf of the City of Holly Springs.
4. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
5. The city council hereby ratifies the signature of the Mayor and City Council this 22nd day of January 2026.
